

o 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to submit (in a time and manner required by the Secretary) a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Act of 2020.

- a) The total enrollment during the Spring 2020 semester is 9,367. Of those students, Stockton University estimates that at least 85% of the students are therefore eligible to receive these grants, assuming they incurred expenses related to the disruption in campus operations due to the coronavirus.
- 5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
 - a) As of June 18, 2020, 1,543 students have received a payment of Stockton CARES Emergency Grant.
 - 6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
 - a) Stockton University determined student eligibility by reviewing the criteria set forth by the Secretary of Education. The amount of each grant was determined using the expenses incurred as reported by the student on their request document and the funding available. Special consideration was given to those students who have demonstrated need such as unemployment and Pell Grant eligibility. In some cases the total requested amounts were capped by the maximum Pell Grant of 2019/2020.
 - 7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
