Zogby conducted a telephone survey on Monday and Tuesday of 600 voters in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 9th legislative districts in southern New Jersey.

The Zogby poll shows Corzine does best in the 1st and 4th legislative districts while Christie's greatest support is in the 9th Legislative District.
