Stockton College dedicates Robert M. Hughes Collection ceremonies Wednesday

The collection, which chronicles the administrator's years of public service, was formally dedicated during a ribbon-cutting ceremony Wednesday at the Robert M. Hughes Center for Public Policy.

In addition to a permanent archive and memorabilia, the collection will be housed in a new building on the southern New Jersey campus. The building will be named in honor of the collection and will be useful to students and researchers in the years ahead.

The collection includes correspondence, photographs and memorabilia from the school's history. The collection is housed throughout the building at the Robert M. Hughes Center for Public Policy.

In addition to the collection, a permanent archive of citations from the Congressional Record, press releases, press clips, newsletters and other materials are housed in the Robert M. Hughes Center.

The collection represents over five decades of public service.

The dedication included remarks by Hughes, Stockton Trustee Curtis E. Roberts, Robert M. Hughes Center Director David Douglas, Center Steering Committee Chairman William S. Stockton, Stockton Provost and Vice President Jeffrey Kesselman, School Assistant for External Relations and Deputy Center President Michael Fak.
