Stockton poll shows incu mbent legislators from both parties leading races in 2nd District

Atlantic County voters apparently with legislators of their split direct enough that they want to keep them in officeaccording to the fist poll of the season, released Wednesday.

Incumbent state Sen. Jim Whelan, D-Atlandind Assemblymen John Amodeo and Chris Brown, both R-Atlantic, all hold healty leads on their challengers carding to the poll of the 2nd Legislative District by the William J. Hugh exenter for Public Policy at Richard Stockton College. The 2nd District includes most of Atlantic County.

Daniel J. Douglas, Hughe Center director, said the polls shound be treated as gospel. Early polls typically favor incumbents.

In the Assembly, about 48 pert thought well of Amodeo and Americant thought well of Brown. But 40 and 45 percent, respectively, also had no opinion on Amodeo and Brown.

Among the Democrats, a little **me**othan half of those polleted no opinion on Mazzeo and Russo, although about a third of those thought favorable of them both.

The poll also found Republican Gov. Chris Christied a 56 to 34 percentage point lead over his Democratic challenger, state Sen. Baabarono. Only 6 peront were undecided.

Newark's mayor, Democrat CoByooker, held a 49 to 38 premt lead over the Republican candidate, former Bogota Mayor Stellonegan, in the Oct. 150 pecial U.S. Senate election.

The Hughes Center's Stockton Polling Institute conted the poll of 596 likely voters Sept. 7 to 9. It has a four percentage point margin of erTone institute plans fute polls on the 1st, 2nd and 9th Legislative District this electi season as well as on statewide races.
