# Rowan adds Medals of Excellence to Commencement Week programming

Rowan University, which is changing its Commencement program in 2015 from two ceremonies over two days to six ceremonies over four days, is starting another new tradition this year: honoring individuals with Medals of Excellence.

The awards will be presented during college-specific Commencement ceremonies in May in one of three categories: Distinguished Service to the University or their community; Research; and Alumni Achievement.

"By awarding Medals of Excellence we recognize the contributions that individuals make to our institution, our communities and the world around us," said Rowan President Dr. Ali Houshmand.

## RCOB awards two

The William G. Rohrer College of Business will present its first-ever Medal of Excellence for Alumni Achievement to Commencement speaker Mike Fasulo and a Medal of Excellence for Distinguished Service to Daniel Ruotolo.

Fasulo, a 1982 graduate of Glassboro State College, is president and COO of Sony Electronics where he's responsible for overseeing the electronics business of Sony Corporation in the United States.

Ruotolo, managing partner of CPA firm Ruotolo, Spewak & Co., of Mt. Laurel, has helped train dozens of Rowan students in accounting and each year some 10 to 15 Rowan students intern with his firm.

Ruotolo also serves as chair of the Rowan University Accounting Advisory Board and was recently instrumental in bringing together that board and the Accounting Mentorship Program to implement a Mock Interview Program.

The first Henry M. Rowan College of Engineering Medal of Excellence for Alumni Achievement will be awarded to Walt Walker, who earned a B.S. in civil engineering from Rowan in 2005 and an M.S. in environmental engineering from Rowan in 2006.

Walker is an environmental engineer with Cardno BCM, in Plymouth Meeting, Pa., a registered professional engineer in Pennsylvania and New Jersey and a recipient of the Rowan Distinguished Young Alumnus Award.

Inspired by his experience as a Rowan student visiting Bangladesh, Walker today is president of the Philadelphia Chapter of the non-profit Engineers Without Borders USA which partners with developing communities to design and build sustainable engineering projects.

The goal, Walker said, is to "build a better world, one community at a time."
