**Galloway, NJ** – Stockton University has been selected to host one Republican and one Democratic primary debate during this year's New Jersey gubernatorial election cycle.

The university's William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy applied to the state's Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) to host a gubernatorial primary debate on Stockton's main campus

Previously, Stockton University has hosted several debates including legislative, congressional and senatorial debates.

Most recently, the Hughes Center sponsored a District 2 legislative debate with Republican Assemblyman Chris Brown and running mate Freeholder Will Pauls and Democratic Assemblyman Vince Mazzeo and running mate Freeholder Colin Bell.
