counselor, a faculty resource team, and a separate orientation for veteran students, as well as aveterans' lounge. Through Veteran Affairs, veterans and service members can explore eligibility for G.I. education benefits, receive referrals to a wide range of support services and connect with their fellow veterans by becoming a part of Stockton's Student Veterans Organization.

An honor chair remembering prisoners of war and those missing in action was permanently installed at Stockton earlier this year. A light shines 24/7 on the honor chair outside the Veterans Lounge, part of the national Rolling Thunder POW/MIA Honor Chair Program bringing daily reminders of the courageous men and women who have not returned home from war.

Stockton is the only higher education institution in the region to receive this honor.

Today Stockton will host a series of events on the main Galloway campus in honor of Veterans Day, beginning at 11 a.m. in front of the Campus Center. Assemblyman Chris Brown, who served in the U.S. Army from 1987-2009, is the keynote speaker.

The Military Times listing noted Stockton's excellent retention and graduation rates and small class sizes, with a student/faculty ratio of 17:1. Staff support for veterans and active service people, participation in the G.I. Bill and Yellow Ribbon program, which supplements G.I. Bill®
