Research Center (STR). Live interviewers conducted the poll from Oct. 15-27, 2014. The poll was conducted with 600

of the 2nd District. The poll's margin of error is +/- 4.0 percentage points at a 95 percent confidence level. MOE is higher for subsets.

"It appears that many of those who were undecided in the earlier poll are breaking for Frank LoBiondo," said Sharon Schulman, Chief Executive Officer of External Affairs and Institutional Research.

Schulman noted that the incumbent had significantly more money available than the challenger at the start of October.

Sixty-eight percent have a favorable view of LoBiondo, with 24 percent unfavorable and 8 percent unfamiliar with him or unsure. Fifty-six percent rate the incumbent's job performance as excellent or good, and 37 percent rate it as fair or poor.

Fourteen percent rate the job performance of the U.S. Congress as a whole as good or excellent, up from 9 percent in the prior poll. Twenty-seven percent rate it as fair, and 59 percent rate it as poor.

Forty-six percent have a favorable view of Hughes, with 26 percent unfavorable. One in five voters (21 percent) are not familiar with the challenger, and 7 percent are unsure about how they feel.

LoBiondo is supported by 89 percent of Republican voters, while Hughes is backed by 72
