Galloway, N.J. – South Jersey played an important part in the struggle for African-American equality. Its citizens fought for racial justice and against segregation in the south, marched on Washington with Martin Luther King, Jr., protested on the Atlantic City boardwalk with the Mississippi Freedom Democrats, and showcased the first Miss Black America contest. The exhibition is open now through Sept. 28 at the Noyes Arts Garage in Atlantic City, N.J.

The exhibition is brought to the African American Heritage Museum of Southern New Jersey in the Arts Garage, at 2200 Fairmount Ave., by Stockton University and the New Jersey Council for the Humanities.

"This project is the culmination of over two years of collaboration between the university and the
