

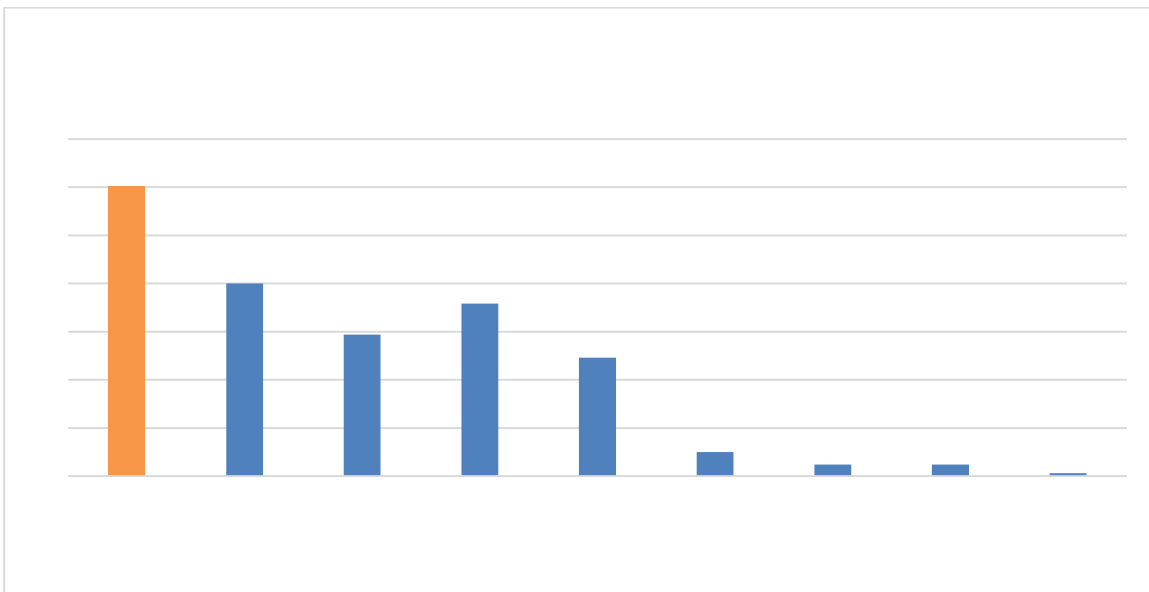
# Stockton Poll: N.J. Recent College Graduates Think Colleges Need To Do More to Tie Academic and Practical Learning

**Galloway, NJ** - Stockton University research reveals that recent college graduates believe the most important college outcome is to get a better job, with 30 percent naming that as their top priority. However, only about one in three (35 percent) says colleges are doing enough to prepare them for a job and career.
