Stockton Hosting Film Viewing, Panel Discussion on Military Sexual Trauma

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Galloway Township, NJ – The Office of Continuing Studies and the Office of Veteran Affairs at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey are hosting a viewing of the film "The Invisible War," followed by a panel discussion on **Wednesday, Nov. 6.** Registration begins at 4 p.m.; the program will begin at 4:30 in the Campus Center Event Room here.

Members of the veteran community will partner with health and human services professionals to examine Military Sexual Trauma (MTS). MTS is the term used by the Department of Veteran Affairs to refer to experiences of sexual assault or repeated, threatening acts of sexual harassment, as experienced by both men and women.

"Providers working with veterans returning from service may not be aware of the scope of the problem or available resources," explained Patrick Shields, coordinator of the Office of Veteran Affairs at Stockton.

A viewing of the film "The Invisible War" will serve as the vehicle to discuss the signs and treatment of MST. A panel discussion will examine the impact of MST and identify strategies for providers and clinicians within the community to therapeutically respond to and support MST survivors.
