'Seeing the Future in the Past' Addresses 1938 Nazi Attack on Jews

The Annual Kristallnacht Lecture sponsored by The Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center will be held on **Monday, Nov. 10, 2014** in The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey's Campus Center Event Room at 7 p.m.

Kristallnacht, also referred to as the Night of Broken Glass, was a large-scale violent attack and massacre of Jews throughout Nazi Germany and Austria on November 9-10, 1938, carried out by the paramilitary wing of the Nazi party and non-Jewish civilians.

The lecture, "Seeing the Future in the Past: Kristallnacht and Genocide" will be presented by Dr. Robert Skloot, Ida E. King Distinguished Visiting Professor of Holocaust Studies for Fall 2014 at Stockton.

Dr. Skloot is an historian and playwright who has previously taught and directed plays at the University of Wisconsin–Madison. He is the author of *The Darkness We Carry: The Drama of the Holocaust* and the editor of the two-volume anthology, *The Theatre of the Holocaust*.

The free lecture is open to the public and will include Dr. Skloot's reflections on the occasion of the 76th anniversary of Kristallnacht-The November Pogrom.
