Galloway Township, NJ- The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey has again been ranked among the nation's top public colleges and universities in the annual survey of America's Best Colleges.

In the listing released today by U.S. News and World Report, Stockton College is placed among the Best Universities/Master's in the North. Ranked in the top tier of this category for the fourth consecutive year, Stockton is tied for 51st place out of 126 institutions. Stockton is ranked in the top 15 among public institutions (13th). The College is ranked with universities offering both undergraduate and master's programs in the northern region of the United States.
