In the play, The Apartment is crumbling, and so are the lives within it. Sheila Callaghan's play is a haunting yet hilarious account of one family, and their apartment's losses. Janice, (played by Mady Welch of Galloway, NJ), has lost her father; Clara, (played by Nicole Clark of Pine Beach, NJ), is losing her daughter; Barbara, (played by Phoebe Gruetter of Deptford, NJ), lost her opportunity; and even The Apartment, (played by Evan Williamson of Island Heights, NJ), is losing his, or its, identity. So, what happens when the glue holding a family together – or holding the paper to the walls – begins to dissolve? Callaghan, in her world containing a personified apartment, 57 cats, Justin Timberlake and Harrison Ford, (both played by John Wisienski of Jackson, NJ), tackles this painful reality head-on, and the answer might just be: Everything crumbles.

"It is rare to work on an authentic piece of theatre that is fulfilling and heartbreaking at the same time, with a creative team in a single space every night that is organic and fully nurtured," says Nicole Clark. "Crumble' is special because you think you're simply going to see a show, but you walk away and it is so much more than that."
