The program recently was awarded a grant from the Philadelphia Higher Education Network for Neighborhood Development (PHENND) to implement a food stamp enrollment project in cooperation with Atlantic Cape Community College, the Community Food Bank of Southern New Jersey (Egg Harbor Twp.), and the South Jersey AIDS Alliance (Atlantic City). Stockton students work weekly to prescreen individuals and families for food stamp eligibility and follow up with clients throughout the process to ensure that they apply for benefits through the Atlantic County Office of Family and Community Development if they are eligible.

Roni Bier, the Service-Learning Assistant at Stockton, is the project coordinator for the food stamp enrollment program. She will represent Stockton at the Conference and present the food stamp enrollment program. Roni is a senior Literature major and a resident of Forked River, New Jersey. Also representing Stockton is Tara Ronda, Coordinator of Service-Learning. Tara is also the secretary of the New Jersey Higher Education Service-Learning Consortium, and she has helped to plan the upcoming conference. Both Roni and Tara hope to recruit members of the community to attend the conference, where participants will learn about numerous community engagement opportunities.

Ms. Hillary Kane, Director for the Philadelphia Higher Education Network for Neighborhood Development, will provide the keynote presentation on the importance of building strong partnerships to support anti-hunger initiatives within the state. Ms. Kane has extensive experience in partnership building through PHENND, which is a consortium of 32 institutions of higher education in the Greater Philadelphia region that seek to help campuses connect to their communities through mutually beneficial service and service-learning partnerships.
