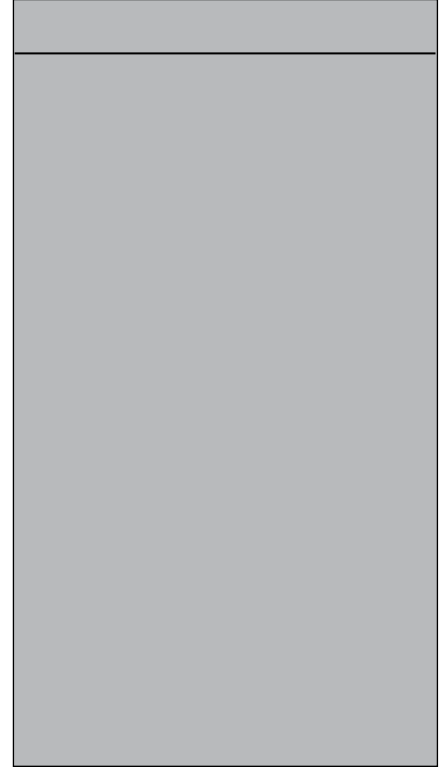


## Hammonton Scholarship Fund Exceeds \$100,000



## Stockton Participates in 48 Blocks Celebration in Atlantic City

Stockton partnered with the Atlantic City Arts Foundation to sponsor “48 Blocks,” a celebration of arts and creativity, displaying 90 projects and events throughout the city on June 24.

48 Blocks featured murals, a labyrinth, concerts, garden tours, poetry readings, a puppet show, a skate demonstration, performances by the Atlantic City Ballet and members of the Bay Atlantic Symphony, and garden tours.

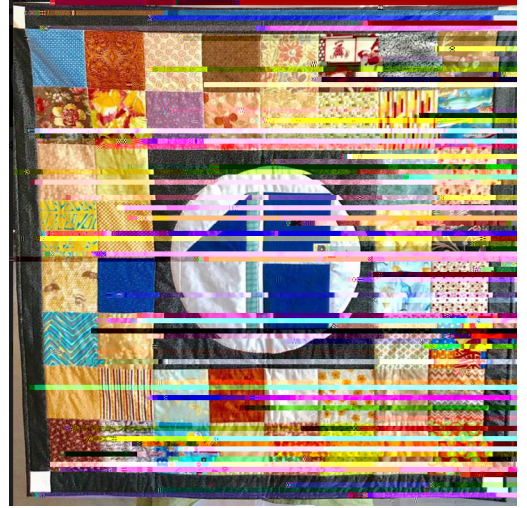
During the event, Stockton’s South Jersey Culture & History Center documented oral histories, scanned photos and photographed memorabilia. The materials will be added to the archives at the Atlantic City Public Library to create future exhibits and cultural events around the material. A closing party for the event was held at Stockton’s Noyes Arts Garage.

Lisa Honaker, dean of the School of Arts & Humanities (ARHU), played an integral role in the planning of the event since its inception. “Putting on this event has been a real grassroots effort,” she said. “It’s a big project with a lot of moving parts, but the community members have really run with it.”

Stockton’s Emari DiGiorgio, associate professor of Writing; Chung-Fan Chang, assistant professor of Art, and Michael Cagno, executive director of the Noyes Museum, were among the many participants.
