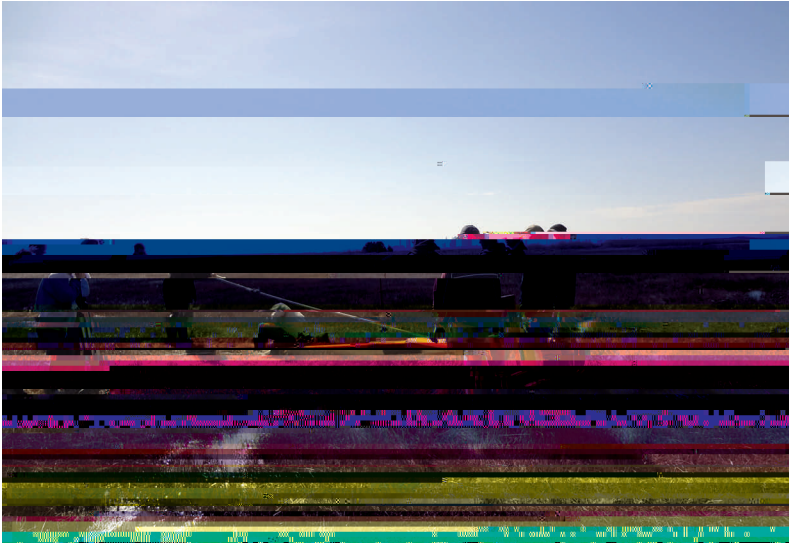

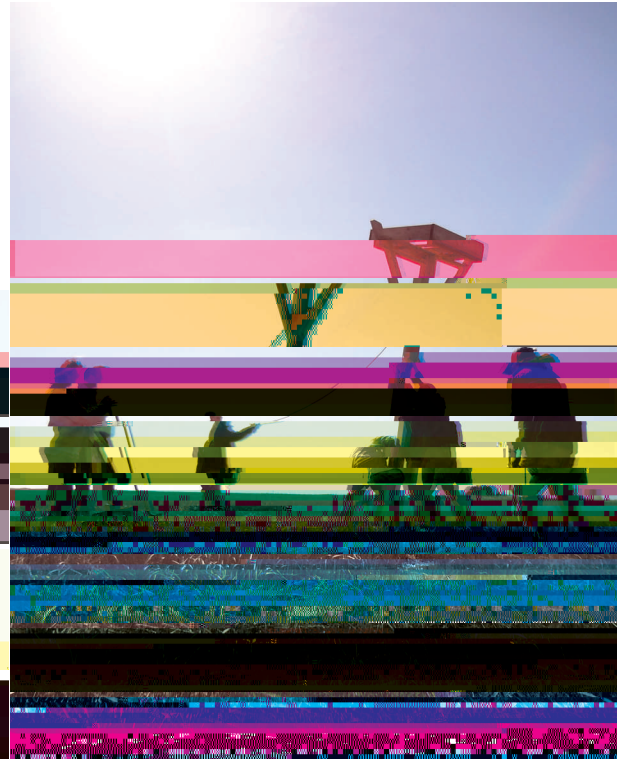

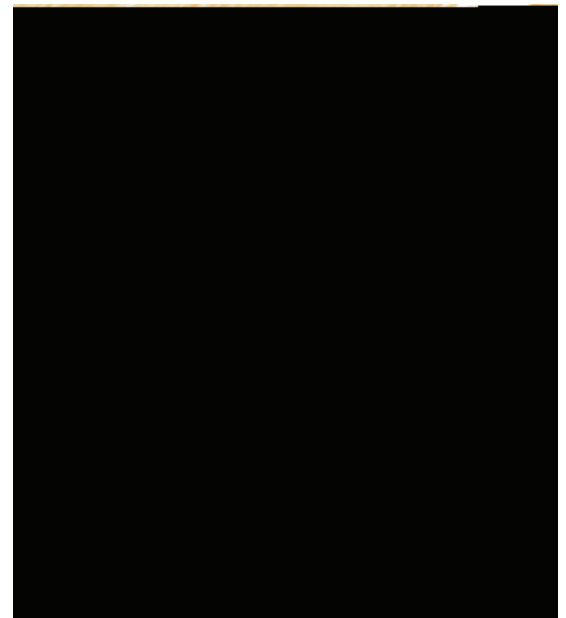


Day of Scholarship Great Success
