On January 27, a delegation of undergraduate and graduate students from Stockton was invited to the United Nations in New York City to observe the 67th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp by Soviet troops. The theme of the observance was "Children and the Holocaust."

Stockton was the only group of college students to attend the ceremony and they were seated in the delegate's section of the United Nations General Assembly.

Prior to the ceremony, the Stockton students, along with Associate Professor of Historical Studies Dr. Michael Hayse and Director of the Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center Gail Rosenthal, were invited to the German Consulate for a breakfast meeting

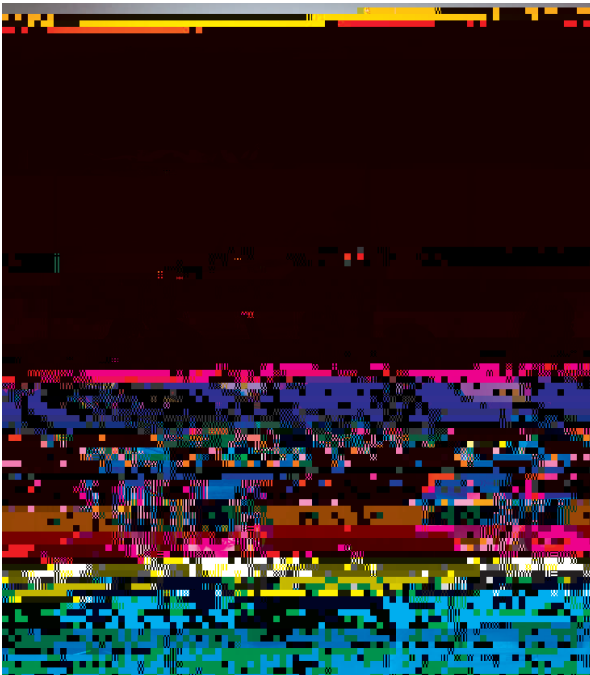
hosted by the Consul General of Germany, Busso von Alvensleben.

The Stockton representatives were the only college students at the breakfast seminar which was

dedicated to the memory of the Holocaust across the generations. The Stockton delegation had the opportunity to talk to the Consul General as well as hear testimony from a Holocaust survivor and his son.
