Michael Angulo Joins Office of General Counsel



Professor Gandica to Speak at Physics Convention

On Saturday, March 24, Adjunct Professor Alfonso Gandica will speak at the American Association of Physics Teachers Convention at Princeton University where he will review the current global energy situation with its geopolitical, economic and environmental dimensions. Special emphasis will be given to "Reinventing Fire: Bold Business Solutions for the new Energy Era," (Chelsea Green Publishing) the recent book by Amory Lovins, founder of the Rocky Mountain Institute. President Bill Clinton calls the book "a wise, detailed, and comprehensive blueprint."

Professor Gandica formed the Information and Systems Science Department at Stockton in 1972. He was also Atlantic City Electric's Project Manager for Stockton's Geothermal Field Project and the Photovoltaic Project on the roof of the Arts & Sciences Building in the mid-1990s. Professor Gandica developed an interdisciplinary seminar, "Energy and Ethics," in 1995 to help students become more aware of the U.S. energy situation and its economic, environmental and political factors.

Professor Gandica is a member of the Stockton Foundation's Board of Trustees. He and his wife Esther live in Linwood, NJ.


