**Geoffrey Gust** joins as an assistant professor of Writing in the First-Year Studies program, after completing a one-year appointment as a visiting assistant professor of Writing at Stockton. Gust earned a Ph.D. in English from the University of York in England, an M.A. in English from Arizona State University, and a B.A. in English, with a concentration in secondary education, from Drake University. He has over a decade of teaching experience at Arizona State University and Temple University, where he taught medieval studies and a variety of literature and writing courses. In 2009, Gust published "Constructing Chaucer."

**Marcy Isabella** joins as an assistant professor of Writing in the First-Year Studies program. She received a Ph.D. in English, with a concentration in rhetoric and composition, from the University of Rhode Island, where she taught a variety of courses in the Writing and Rhetoric major. Isabella also served as interim director of the Writing Center at the University of Rhode Island. Isabella holds an M.A. in English from the University at Albany, The State University of New York. Her research interests include the ways writing and rhetoric can work for and against individuals, communities, and social institutions. In addition, Dr. Isabella has research interests in writing program assessment, writing center pedagogy, teaching practicums, and critical classrooms.

**Nancy Reddy** joins as an assistant professor of Writing in the First-Year Studies program. She received a Ph.D. in Composition and Rhetoric and an M.F.A. in Poetry from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her research interests include writing pedagogy, archival research, and extracurricular literacies and writing groups. Reddy's frst book of poetry, "Double Jinx," was a winner of the 2014 National Poetry Series award and will be published by Milkweed Editions in September 2015.
