






Economic Impact Fact

During FY '11, the College invested nearly \$33 million in capital improvements, such as the Housing V project and the new Campus Center. In addition, the College purchased more than \$21 million in a variety of goods and services, ranging from \$82,831 in office supplies to \$4.5 million in utility expenses.
